With these internal schedule changes, comes a change in our arrival & dismissal procedures. We appreciate your help and patience as we implement these new changes.


ARRIVAL PROCEDURE CHANGE!

Requests for Inside Recess (Exemption from Outdoor Recess)

Your child's health is an important phase of the education program. Children need exercise and fresh air in order to keep healthy and alert. Our supervised playground is a safe and healthy place where your child can participate in a variety of activities. Weather and health permitting, we expect all children to go outside for recess. Children recovering from an illness (no longer in an infectious stage) will be permitted to remain inside at recess time upon written request from parents. If the request is for longer than three days, the school needs a statement from the doctor explaining why the child is well enough to be in school, but is unable to be outside for a short time. In general, it is much better that the children become involved in outside activities rather than to stay in the classroom the entire day.
